It is an encouraging sign, and one that we may surely take to mean an advance in the spiritual life of the parish, that the number of regular communicants has increased lately. Last month the number reached 86, whereas in July, 1905, 15 was the total.

The Managers of the Day School wish to thank the many applicants for the tenancy of the school house; an appointment has now been made.
