



evening had showed a decided improvement. The accounts, which were to be printed and circulated, were then passed. The Vicar then nominated Mr. K. Rotherham as his Warden for the coming year. Mr. H. D. Waters was elected People's Warden, on the proposition of Mr. Sparrow. Both Wardens returned thanks for the honour conferred on them, promising to carry out their duties faithfully. Mrs. W. H. Caddick and Mr. J. Turner were appointed Sidesmen, and Mr. J. Craner, Verger. The matter of cleaning the Church was next discussed, and the Wardens stated that they should be only too pleased to have the Church thoroughly whitewashed, etc., as soon as they get the necessary funds. This matter was also left in their hands. A short discussion took place on the new Education Bill, the Vicar stating that the trust deeds of the school clearly laid it down that the building was erected for the benefit of the children of the poor of the parishes to be instructed in the principles of the Church of England." He and the other Managers would be failing in their sacred duty if they handed over without some great struggle what has thus been entrusted to them. A resolution to this effect was proposed by Mr. Griffin and unanimously passed. The Vicar then thanked the parishioners for their most liberal offerings to him at Easter. He was greatly impressed by the kindness shown him on all hands since his coming among them. A vote of thanks to the Wardens for their work during the year, and one to the Vicar for presiding, finished the proceedings. After the Meeting the two Churchwardens were chosen as lay representatives to represent the Parish at the Archi-diaconal Conference.—*Coventry Standard*.

We were glad to see so many present at the Vestry Meeting. It is surely a promising sign; the Church can only be a real power, when the men take an active interest in her work. Two pressing needs were discussed—the painting of the Church and re-lighting. The Wardens will be grateful for any donations to help them in carrying out this work. Let all do what they can, and 'twill soon be done. We gladly welcome Mr. H. Caddick and Mr. Turner on the staff of officials.
