The Vicar presided, and those present included Messrs. W. H. Caddick, J. Turner, H. Sleath, J. Barnet, H. D. Waters, T. Townshend, F. Pratley, J. Craner, R. J. Cooper, J. Osborne, A. Enser, H. Harrison, H. Loasby.

Mr. Turner presented the accounts for the year. The Offertories for Church Expenses amounted to £68 11s. 3d., parochial and other objects to £64 10s. 4d. The expenditure was £80 15s. 4d., leaving a deficit of £12 4s. 1d. The accounts were passed.

Mr. W. H. Caddick and Mr. J. Turner were re-elected Churchwardens; Sidesmen, Mr. Sleath and Mr. Barnet.

It was decided to have a special collection at the Harvest Festival to clear off the debt on the painting, of £29.

A hearty vote of thanks was given to the Wardens for their successful work during the year, and also to the members of the Choir, Sunday School Teachers and the Auditor.
